8

9 MR. AUTERI: Okay. At this time, Mayor,
10 would you like to take public comment?

11 MAYOR STACK: Sure. Anyone wishing to
12 comment at this time, please step forward, state
13 your name and address for the record?

14

15 MR. MITCHELL: So back here again, guys.
16 How many weeks I got to come back? Raymond
17 Mitchell, 9 Lincoln Place, East Rutherford, New
18 Jersey.

19 Ms. Martinetti -- can you hand this to
20 her, please? This is what --

21 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: What do you have?
22 Start talking, your time is running.

23 MR. MITCHELL: Since March 18th, Mr.
24 Brian Stack, I've been asking to you investigate
25 my father's mystery death at North Bergen

1 Harborage, March 30, 2020. Can you tell me where
2 you were at that time? March 30th, 2020? Okay.

3 There was an emergency drill September
4 19, 2019, in the Hackensack Meridian Palisade and
5 also the North Bergen Harborage. And then after
6 that, six months the pandemic kicked in. Do you
7 know anything about that, with emergency
8 management?

9 Can you tell me about that picture right
10 there? You know my father, Mr. Stack, how long
11 you know my father for and Ms. Martinetti's
12 husband as well knows my father for a very long
13 time as well. Do you know? Okay.

14 So now I'm in courts in Bergen County,
15 me and my brother have been having issues in
16 Bergen County. I'm going to pass this up to show.
17 His judge, Mr. Antoniewicz, from Hudson County,
18 administrative judge -- I need those papers back
19 as well.

20 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Those you want back,
21 I got you.

22 MR. MITCHELL: So I'm here -- I OPRA'd
23 in the clerk's office, okay because you said that
24 you were going to investigate it. Mr. Stack? Mr.
25 Stack, did you say you were going to investigate,

1 yes or no, to the health department of the state
2 with Governor Murphy and also the human services?
3 Can you tell me what happened to this? Are you
4 going to investigate? Do you know Antoniewicz,
5 the judge? And Matthew Seymour, in Bergen County,
6 how I'm being obstructed? And my brother also
7 with his children? Do you have anything to do
8 with that, you and Governor Murphy? Because he's
9 the one that appointed Antoniewicz in 2018. And
10 also Mr. Matthew Seymour, a New Milford councilman
11 as well. I put your name in there, too, Mr.
12 Stack, for that court right there as well, so you
13 know. Because there's no way that we have been
14 having problems for the last four and a half years
15 here, since my dad's death on March 30, 2020, at
16 Hackensack Meridian Palisade, the North Bergen
17 Harborage. And then there was a pandemic. Did
18 you know anything about the pandemic, Mr. Stack,
19 before it happened? You and Bob Menendez, yes or
20 no? Did you guys know about the pandemic, tell
21 everybody in the world right now, it's a worldwide
22 thing, I called everybody, WHO, CDC, Department of
23 Justice, FBI, all these places. It seems like I'm
24 being obstructed all the way up and down. Bergen
25 County, Esther Suarez, Bergen County, she's

1 obstructing me also. Also with the Chief Dennis
2 Miller in Secaucus, do you have anything to do
3 with that? All these people I'm having issues
4 with in the last four years.

5 You're the judiciary chairman, correct?
6 I shouldn't have all these problems in the
7 pandemic. Also the OPRA, Ms. Martinetti, can you
8 tell me about that? Why is it coming from your
9 office? Is anybody going to talk here? Does
10 anybody know anything?

11 So you see this picture of my father,
12 he's strangled here, it looks like. Mr. Stack,
13 you see this guy, I emailed you in your mayor's
14 office. I was strangled by you in Schuetzen Park
15 and I let it all go because why? My father's
16 house was raided, Charles Pratt's house got
17 raided. Irrizary leaves to Florida, I don't know
18 what happened to my other witness that
19 demonstrated it.

20 You're the only one with all the power,
21 Mr. Stack. Can you tell me what's going on here?
22 Are you going to investigate or not? What's going
23 on?

24 MR. AUTERI: Thank you, sir, your time
25 is expired.

1 MAYOR STACK: Thank you very much thank
2 you for your comments. Next.

3 MR. MITCHELL: So he's not saying --

4 MR. AUTERI: Sir, please step back.
5 Your time is expired.

6 MR. MITCHELL: I am sir, just putting my
7 stuff away. You must have known about the
8 pandemic, that's for sure. Hackensack Meridian
9 and North Bergen Harborage --

10 MR. AUTERI: Sir, you need to stop
11 talking because your time is over.

12 MR. MITCHELL: I can say whatever I
13 want, sir. You should be arresting this guy, if
14 you know any crime is going on. Ain't you an
15 attorney?

16 MR. AUTERI: Sir, please, state your
17 name.

18 MR. MITCHELL: Ain't you supposed to
19 be --

20 MR. AUTERI: Sir, you need to stop, your
21 time is over, okay. We need to be fair to
22 everyone.

23 MR. MITCHELL: Is he fair to me? He
24 don't even fucking answer me, this guy. He's a
25 scumbag.

1 MR. AUTERI: Sir, the floor is yours.

2 MR. CARILLO: Can I get my time back?

3 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: You'll have it.

4 MR. AUTERI: We'll give you ten seconds
5 back.

6 MR. CARILLO: My name is Jose Carillo,
7 Junior. What you are shaking your head for? I
8 haven't even started talking. What a joke, bro,
9 you know that, right? I got a bunch of complaints
10 here. I got one, two, three, four, five, six,
11 seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, twelve
12 complaints that you never complied to.

13 This is the one that you had your little
14 (inaudible) and your little donation. I was
15 assaulted. I was assaulted, Brian Stack. Nothing
16 was ever done. The complaint, the way it was
17 written, it was in their favor, not in mine. But
18 I was assaulted. When I was walking with a cast
19 and a cane. Nothing was done because you ordered
20 to take my out of the area. Yeah, you can moan
21 and you can do whatever you want to do, but this
22 going to stop pretty soon, okay.

23 Now, you remember when you charged me
24 illegally? Yo, my man, I'm talking to you.
25 Brian.

1 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Jose.

2 MR. CARILLO: No, no, it's not
3 getting -- you know what, this is getting --

4 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: It's loud.

5 MR. CARILLO: -- out of character with
6 this bullshit already, bro. You know what I'm
7 saying, he charged me saying I was assaulted,
8 I'm --

9 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: I'll show you --

10 MR. CARILLO: -- all the judge, all --

11 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: You know that --

12 MR. CARILLO: -- I was assaulted, I've
13 been threatened, I've been getting threatening
14 calls. I've been getting -- I got a family, and I
15 got to provide for my family, and you're not doing
16 nothing about it, bro, okay. I'm going on
17 six months without nothing coming to my fucking
18 plate.

19 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Jose.

20 MR. CARILLO: Nothing coming to my
21 plate, okay. You lowball me on a lawsuit. How
22 many times am I going to address this issue to
23 you? And your attorney is right there looking at
24 me like I'm an asshole.

25 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Jose, calm down.

1 MR. TRUTH: You have a right, don't
2 interrupt him, Bergbauer.

3 MR. CARILLO: This is bullshit, bro.
4 This is bullshit already. I'm addressing you
5 about the situation and what's going on and you
6 just keep looking at me like I'm a fucking piece
7 of shit and I'm tired of this shit already.
8 Numerous complaints. Sir, I know what you're
9 saying, Captain, but you know what, this is --

10 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Take it easy.

11 MR. CARILLO: All right. What he's
12 saying is right, what he's saying is right.

13 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: -- a good
14 relationship with you.

15 MR. CARILLO: That's true.

16 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: You'll get more
17 across by talking --

18 MR. CARILLO: Definitely, definitely.
19 This is, you know what I'm saying, a whole
20 different thing. What I'm saying it's a shame
21 that he has the commissioners here, all the
22 commissioners are here, you know what I'm saying.
23 And they're trying to do what they can do and the
24 best that they can do. And all he does is he
25 wants all his opinions towards him. And, listen,

1 just to explain to you, before you start running
2 your mouth, and you start saying everything, Leroy
3 is here doing what Leroy is doing. I'm here doing
4 what I'm doing. And I'm bringing stuff to your
5 attention that you're not taking off.

6 I was assaulted, never did nothing about
7 it. You know that I was shot a couple years ago,
8 you know that, right? On 5th Street and Paterson
9 Plank Road, I was shot numerous times, you never
10 did the investigation. They never did an
11 investigation.

12 You know, when I was -- your lieutenant
13 set me up. You remember when I saved a person's
14 life on 27th Street and New York Avenue, you were
15 supposed to give me a plaque, a certificate, and
16 an award, did you ever give me that? Did you ever
17 do that? No, you never did that.

18 When was the first time that you ever --
19 when you found out that I was going through the
20 issues and the situation with my daughter, did you
21 ever call me? But you call me to find out if you
22 can get a vote. When you want a vote, you call.
23 Oh, you didn't vote for me, you didn't vote for
24 me, you call then. But when my daughter was sick,
25 did you ever call me? Did you ever say something?

1 No. It's a shame, your commissioner -- there was
2 only two commissioners here, two commissioners and
3 I'm not going to mention their names because I
4 don't want you to drag them to the floor, the way
5 you do all the time to everybody. Only two
6 commissioners that came to the house and called
7 me. And asked me what I need, what I want, and
8 what they can do. And I always told them
9 everything is okay. But you never did nothing.

10 All you do is take and hurt and
11 desecrate. You say you're a standup man, you --

12 MR. AUTERI: Thank you, sir, you're out
13 of time.

14 CAPTAIN BERGBAUER: Thank you.

15 MR. CARILLO: You can hand all that to
16 him, do whatever you want with it.

17 MR. TRUTH: Hello, everyone. First
18 question I've got Stack, Mr. Brian Stack, Mr.
19 Brian Stack, have you ever had a romantic
20 relationship with Esther Suarez, the prosecutor of
21 Hudson County? I've received numerous, numerous
22 allegations, which I will be investigating deeply
23 in the coming weeks, that would be a conflict of
24 interest.

25 Now, I'm going to point out some

1 absurdities, Stack, these are Mayor Brian Stack
2 absurdities. First of all, look how tiny this
3 room is. This is an extraordinarily small room,
4 barely enough room to fit the people here. I
5 heard some people left because they didn't think
6 there was enough room. But look at this here,
7 there is this line far, far away from the
8 commissioners.

9 Now, Brian Stack, and the other
10 commissioners, has anyone ever, ever attacked you
11 or tried to attack you during a commissioner's
12 meeting ever? Because this line wasn't here when
13 I first started. Mayor Stack, hello, are you
14 suddenly mute again?

15 So, look at all this room. This has got
16 to be breaking some open public meeting act here.
17 Then look at this. Since I started, there was no
18 line. When I started talking, there was just
19 space here. Then -- and look the line doesn't
20 even want to be there. And then look at these
21 cameras, they have one, two cameras pointed at us,
22 we the people -- which they have a right to do.
23 But we are going to be requesting those cameras
24 because that's our footage.

25 And then the other absurdity, Mayor

1 Brian Stack -- what are you doing, playing
2 tiddlywinks here with your little finger? Let's
3 zoom in and see what you're doing there. You and
4 the other commissioners ignore us. The attorney
5 is the only one that actually looks at anyone,
6 which I actually have a little respect for that.
7 All the other ones are condescending and
8 extraordinarily disdainful to we the people. How
9 do you feel about that, Stack, that you are so
10 non-respected? Your father would not be proud.

11 I got a couple other things I want to
12 share as well. And one is that why are the
13 teachers, the Board of Education teachers, why are
14 they teaching with no contract? How is that
15 possible? Mayor Stack and the commissioners, do
16 you think that's right, that the teachers should
17 be working with no contract? Is there not enough
18 pay to play on top, Stack?

19 Brian, do you dream about me when you
20 sleep? I bet you do. Also, I hear you're messing
21 with the contract negotiations for the police,
22 holding that over them instead of giving them a
23 fair contract. Because I support your great
24 police officers in Union City, New Jersey. And I
25 support the great teachers in Union City, New

1 Jersey. But I sure as hell don't support you.

2 And the people that actually really know
3 what's going on, Stack, they know that your time
4 as mayor, as state senator of New Jersey, and as
5 the head of the judiciary committee, is coming to
6 a very swift end. Would you like to make a
7 prediction, Brian, how long until you'll be
8 indicted behind Senator Bob Menendez and Mayor
9 Adams? You can throw out a number, a day, a week,
10 37 days? Anyone have any predictions here?

11 Michelle Zeron. Sergeant Zeron there, how many
12 days until Mayor Stack is indicted?

13 And here's the thing, Mayor Stack, I
14 heard you started off good. I heard that people
15 used to love you, that you were a good man. At
16 some point, you turned. The people who believe in
17 you that helped you to get to office, with the
18 coup you did against Rudy. At some point, you
19 turned.

20 Do you know that I found a rock with
21 your name today in Union City, I posted it on my
22 Facebook earlier. There's literally a rock in
23 Union City that Brian Stack named after him,
24 called the Brian Stack rock. Before I recorded, I
25 saw three dogs urinate on that rock. I guess I

1 could have stopped them, but I didn't. I'm guilty.

2 So, Mayor Stack, I'm going to give you
3 an opportunity to resign now. And you're
4 laughing, but when you're in handcuffs, which will
5 be coming sooner rather than later, I guarantee
6 you, you will not be laughing. And the people
7 will be free of a terrorist. You accused me of
8 being a terrorist, it's on your website. People
9 that accuse you with proof. Good night.

10 MAYOR STACK: Anyone further that would
11 like to speak? Seeing none, I'll make a motion to
12 close public comment period.

13 MR. AUTERI: Motion by Mayor Stack.

14 COMMISSIONER VALDIVIA: Second.

15 MR. AUTERI: Second by Commissioner
16 Valdivia.

17 Commissioner Fernandez.

18 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yes.

19 MR. AUTERI: Commissioner Grullon.

20 COMMISSIONER GRULLON: Yes.

21 MR. AUTERI: Commissioner Valdivia.

22 COMMISSIONER VALDIVIA: Yes.

23 MR. AUTERI: Mayor Stack.

24 MAYOR STACK: Yes.

6 MAYOR STACK: Mr. Gonzalez, you're next.

7 MR. GONZALEZ: Good evening, Mayor.

8 We have five ABC matters today. The
9 first one is Ceviche Time, LLC, they're located at
10 4538 Bergenline Avenue. They're represented by
11 Ivan Paneque.

12 As we do with regard to any of the
13 appearances here, we actually had an opportunity
14 to have a plea hearing. And at that point, we
15 discussed the possibility of a resolution. As
16 such, in this case, we have reached a resolution,
17 where it is our recommendation that there would be
18 a 30-day suspension. The violations are sale
19 after hours, there was two employees without
20 employee licenses, and there was some
21 discrepancies as to who the manager was. It was
22 about 2:30 in the morning when this occurred.
23 Based on that and our review with Lieutenant
24 Dunlay and Sergeant Zeron, it would be our
25 recommendation for a 30-day suspension. Of which
I've been advised by Mr. Paneque that they wish to
accept.

1 Mr. Paneque, if you could place your
2 name on the record?

3 MR. PANEQUE: Yes. Good evening, Ivan
4 Paneque on behalf of Ceviche Time.

5 MAYOR STACK: And basically, do you
6 agree to everything that Mr. Gonzalez just said,
7 Mr. Paneque?

8 MR. PANEQUE: Yes, Mr. Mayor. It would
9 be a suspension from November 4th through
10 December 3rd. And I'd like to place on the record
11 that my client has taken swift action. He's
12 gotten rid of the employees that were responsible
13 for this. He knows that ultimately he's
14 responsible and wants to do better.

15 MR. GONZALEZ: These are consecutive
16 days, there's no holdover, I'm not doing that.

17 MAYOR STACK: Lieutenant, do you have
18 anything -- or, Sergeant, anything further you
19 wanted to add to this matter?

20 LIEUTENANT DUNLAY: Just that we're
21 enforcing the quality of life issues in the City.
22 This was an issue that was brought to our
23 attention because of outside drinking, public
24 drinking by the patrons, which, when the officers
25 went to investigate, they further noticed that the

1 establishment was open after hours.

2 MAYOR STACK: Good work on this. Thank
3 you. I'll make a motion to approve.

4 MR. AUTERI: Motion by Mayor Stack to
5 approve the penalty.

6 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Second.

7 MR. AUTERI: Second by Commissioner
8 Fernandez.

9 Commissioner Fernandez.

4 MR. GONZALEZ: The next matter is Agave
5 Restaurant, LLC, located at 4317 Bergenline
6 Avenue. We have the interpreter because the
7 gentleman who owns Agave is not very well versed
8 in English.

9
10 G U I L L E R M O M A R T I N E Z, an
11 interpreter of the SPANISH language, after having
12 been duly sworn, did interpret the following
13 testimony:

14
15 MR. GONZALEZ: Please place your name on
16 the record.

17 MR. VALERA (through the interpreter):
18 Juan Carlos Valera.

19 MR. GONZALEZ: Mr. Valera, you
20 understand that if you wanted to have an attorney,
21 we would adjourn this matter and allow to you get
22 an attorney. You've explained to me you don't
23 want to, you wish to proceed; is that correct?

24 MR. VALERA: Yes.

25 MR. GONZALEZ: And I know the Mayor will

1 ask you and I'd ask him to ask you now if you want
2 an attorney, just so it's coming from someone
3 other than myself?

4 MR. VALERA: Yes.

5 MR. GONZALEZ: Okay. You also were at
6 the plea hearing meeting and I explained to you
7 that the violation is a paper violation, your
8 books were incomplete, and that was the second
9 time that we gave you the opportunity. The first
10 time, we dismissed the matter and held it in
11 abeyance, so this is actually the third time that
12 the paperwork was not correct; is that correct?

13 MR. VALERA: The second time.

14 MR. GONZALEZ: And you have agreed to a
15 five-day suspension; is that correct?

16 MR. VALERA: Yes.

17 MR. GONZALEZ: Are you satisfied with
18 that?

19 MR. VALERA: No, but I will accept the
20 decision and the rules that --

21 MR. GONZALEZ: No, no, I mean if you're
22 not -- if you're not satisfied at any moment with
23 the offer that we've provided to you, you do not
24 have to accept it.

25 MAYOR STACK: Maybe even consult, sir,

1 with an attorney. Then we could grant
2 adjournment.

3 MR. VALERA: No, I'm okay.

4 MAYOR STACK: Are you sure he doesn't
5 want to maybe consult with an attorney and seek
6 advice? He has that right.

7 MR. VALERA: No, sir, it's okay.

8 MR. GONZALEZ: You've advised me that
9 the five days you would want suspended would be
10 from November 25th through November 29th; is that
11 correct?

12 MR. VALERA: Correct.

13 MR. GONZALEZ: I would, under the
14 circumstances, based on it being the second
15 violation, a paper violation, five days would be
16 appropriate. The first offense, we actually
17 dismissed with a warning.

18 MAYOR STACK: And this is on Agave,
19 right?

20 MR. GONZALEZ: Yes.

21 MAYOR STACK: Okay. I'll make a motion
22 to approve.

23 MR. AUTERI: Motion by Mayor Stack to
24 accept the suspension.

25 MAYOR STACK: And he's -- sir, he's

1 agreeing to a five-day suspension?

2 MR. VALERA: Yes. I also asked the
3 attorney if they could reduce that to four days,
4 so I can start working --

5 MAYOR STACK: That's why I'm asking does
6 he want to go back and maybe confer with an
7 attorney and we could set it up, we can adjourn
8 this? We can do that, if you like. Tell him.

9 MR. GONZALEZ: I would probably think,
10 since it's the second time he's not sure, let's
11 adjourn it and let him speak to an attorney.

12 MAYOR STACK: I think that's best.

13 MR. GONZALEZ: I think that's
14 appropriate.

15 MAYOR STACK: All right. This way he
16 can confer with an attorney, just to protect his
17 rights.

18 MR. VALERA: I don't want to come back,
19 it's okay with five days.

20 MAYOR STACK: But I'd rather you go and
21 think about it a little bit and we'll set up in
22 two weeks or whatever is appropriate that you go
23 and seek legal counsel.

24 MR. VALERA: No, no, I'm good.

25 MAYOR STACK: You sure?

1 MR. VALERA: Yeah, I'm sure.

2 MAYOR STACK: Mr. Gonzalez?

4 Mayor, I think it would actually -- just
5 if we could carry this for two weeks?

5 MR. GONZALEZ: Our next matter is La
6 Pupusa Loca 2, located at 4709 Bergenline Avenue.
7 Can you state your name for the record?

8 MR. ARIAS: Peter Arias.

9 MR. GONZALEZ: Mr. Arias met with us at
10 the plea hearing. And the violation alleged here
11 was a violation of the camera ordinance and also
12 there was missing the twelve-page application.
13 Lieutenant Dunlay had confirmed and looked, the
14 application was in fact correct, it was just
15 double sided, so it wasn't counted properly. And
16 an inspection of the cameras actually shows that
17 all the cameras that are recording outside record
18 60 days. And in addition to that, this gentleman
19 has a very large terabyte system that probably
20 records for six months.

21 And based on that, and his compliance,
22 we would be looking for a dismissal on this.

23 MAYOR STACK: Okay. Lieutenant,
24 Sergeant, do you have anything further you would
25 like to add?

 LIEUTENANT DUNLAY: Yes, sir. The

1 initial report when the officers did the
2 investigation was a 58 -- it only held short of
3 60 days. However, the ordinance only calls for
4 outdoor cameras, what they checked are the inside
5 cameras, which are only -- when we did further
6 check of the outside cameras, they're in full
7 compliance.

8 MAYOR STACK: And should we do anything
9 further, in your opinion, with the ordinance at
10 all?

11 LIEUTENANT DUNLAY: I think the
12 ordinance is pretty tight.

13 MAYOR STACK: Okay.

14 LIEUTENANT DUNLAY: With special
15 conditions and stuff, what we've done in the past,
16 we can visit that. Not with this gentleman, but
17 with future violations.

18 MAYOR STACK: Okay. Thank you very
19 much, Lieutenant. I'll make a motion to approve
20 the dismissal as per Mr. Gonzalez.

21 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Second.

22 MR. AUTERI: Motion by Mayor Stack and

5 MR. GONZALEZ: The next matter is
6 Salvadorian Bar and Restaurant.

7 This is also a camera violation and in
8 respect to the proofs because she did attend --
9 I'm sorry, please, state your name for the record.

10 MS. RIVERA (through the interpreter):
11 Maria Rivera.

12 MR. GONZALEZ: Ms. Rivera actually came
13 with her and her son and provided to us
14 information which shows that the cameras are
15 actually recording more than 60 days. But as a
16 result of a blackout or spike out that we had in
17 town, the cameras shut down and they didn't record
18 for two days. So when they did their inspection,
19 it showed that it was 58 days. And I think under
20 the circumstances, when they've shown proof that,
21 in fact, it's operating and it's a pretty good
22 excuse in my opinion, that once they found out
23 that it was not working fully, they had somebody
24 come in, reset it. And now, it's in compliance.
25 I think the two days being out as a result of a
 blackout would warrant a dismissal.

1 MAYOR STACK: Okay. Lieutenant, did you
2 have anything you wanted to add to this or
3 Sergeant? No, okay. As per Mr. Gonzalez's
4 recommendation, we'll make a motion to dismiss.

5 MR. AUTERI: Motion to dismiss made by
6 Mayor Stack.

7 COMMISSIONER VALDIVIA: Second.

8 MR. AUTERI: Second by Commissioner
9 Valdivia.

10 Commissioner Fernandez.

11 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yes.

12 MR. AUTERI: Commissioner Grullon.

13 COMMISSIONER GRULLON: Yes.

14 MR. AUTERI: Commissioner Valdivia.

5 MR. GONZALEZ: The last matter is El
6 Papaturro, located at 1018 Summit Avenue. Please
7 state your name for the record.

8 MR. CARLOS: Good evening. The name is
9 Juan Carlos.

10 MR. GONZALEZ: Juan, you understand
11 you're a corporation, if you wanted to --

12 MR. AUTERI: I'm sorry, Mr. Gonzalez,
13 can we swear him in, please?

14 J U A N C A R L O S, after having been duly
15 sworn or affirmed, did testify as follows:

16
17 MR. GONZALEZ: Thank you. As I was
18 saying, you are held as a corporation. If you
19 wanted to, you could adjourn this matter to get an
20 attorney?

21 MR. CARLOS: No.

22 MR. GONZALEZ: I understand.

23 MR. CARLOS: I agreed with that.

24 MR. GONZALEZ: No, I understand, but I
25 want it clear on the record also. And at the plea

1 meeting, I told you the same situation, that if
2 you want had to adjourn it, we would adjourn it.
3 It doesn't hold anything against you and you
4 decided you want to proceed without an attorney;
5 is that correct?

6 MR. CARLOS: That's correct.

7 MR. GONZALEZ: Okay. And there's a
8 situation that on September 8, 2024, at this
9 location, there was a brawl. And this is where
10 the cameras actually are helpful, in the sense
11 that it shows that the fight that started inside
12 was spontaneous. And it would be something that
13 we would not be able to stop.

14 But, unfortunately, the person who
15 started the fight, initiated the fight, was
16 actually at the location for some time, so he was
17 pretty intoxicated. So we're not going to proceed
18 with the brawl, but the serving to an intoxicated
19 person. Usually, that would be at least a 15-day
20 suspension. But what this gentleman has done --
21 and I wish, maybe I should have taken him first --
22 is he called the cops. He was proactive. He
23 cooperated with the police during the
24 investigation, gave them the names of everybody,
25 when the others parties that were involved weren't

1 responding.

2 So I think based on that, instead of a
3 15-day suspension, a five-day suspension would be
4 fair and appropriate under the circumstances. And
5 it would have shown the other individuals that
6 we're not here to punish them, we really are here
7 for compliance of the ABC laws. This gentleman
8 has worked hard at it. And I think under the
9 circumstances, five days is warranted instead of a
10 15-day suspension.

11 MAYOR STACK: Sir, did you have anything
12 you wanted to add or do you want to have an
13 attorney with you?

14 MR. CARLOS: No, no. I agree with that.
